#### 1 PERSONAL PARTICULARS

# 1.1 Updates

It is important to update school of any changes in your daughter's/ward's particulars (such as name, address, contact numbers) so that records are up to date in case of emergencies.

An exercise will be conducted in early January for parents/guardians to update their particulars. A link will be sent to parents/guardians via Parents Gateway (PG).

Annual school fees payable is spread over 12 months of the academic year. Students who join the school on or before 5 February will have to pay fees from January. Those who withdraw on or after 5 October will have to pay fees for October, November, and December as well.

The preferred mode of payment is GIRO.

Other bank account holders will need to complete a hardcopy GIRO application form and submit the original signed form to the school.

There is no need to submit a new application if students are already on GIRO.

Deductions will be made on the 26<sup>th</sup> day of each month (February – December). If the 26<sup>th</sup> day of the month is a weekend or public holiday, the deduction will happen on the next working day.

The fees for January and February are combined into one bill for deduction in February, hence there will not be any deduction in January. Please ensure that there are sufficient funds in the bank account for deduction.

#### 3 OTHER FEES & PAYMENT MATTERS

# 3.1 Sec 1 Orientation T-shirt and Name Tags

All students will be required to purchase an Orientation T-shirt and school name tags.

#### a) Orientation T-Shirt

Cost per shirt: \$5.60

For Singapore citizens, the cost of the Orientation T-shirt will be deducted from the student's Edusave fund.

## b) School Name Tag

Cost per student: \$5.50

Before the school's name tags are issued to the students, they will be given a temporary name tag (to be returned upon issuance of the school's name tag in February 2026).

A School Bill will be issued later for payment of the above 2 items (estimated billing period: February/March).

#### 3.2 Enrichment Programmes

As part of the holistic development of students, the school has arranged for Enrichment Programmes for all students. These may include Personal Effectiveness and Reading Programmes. Details on the amount payable for Enrichment Programmes will be shared at a later date.

#### 3.3 CCA – Personal Equipment and Gear

Students who are interested in joining the following CCAs are to note that loan sets for training and practice may be available for students. Students may wish to purchase their own personal equipment and gear. While not totally necessary, some students may wish to purchase the following on their own.

- String Ensemble (E.g. violin instrument)
- Bowling (E.g. bowling balls and shoes)
- Fencing (E.g. weapon and fencing suit)
- Floorball (E.g. floorball stick)

Students interested in joining any of these CCAs should check with the teacher-in-charge on the matter.

#### 4 REGISTRATION FOR PAYNOW

With the increasing digitalisation of government services, MOE would like to encourage all parents to register their children's bank account with **PayNow** using the children's BC/NRIC number. The activation of PayNow will facilitate the prompt **disbursement** of monies (e.g. Edusave award) for the child and avoid delays through the filling in and processing of forms or from physical visits to banks for the deposit of cheques.

## 5 FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE SCHEME (FAS) FROM MINISTRY OF EDUCATION

#### 5.1 Financial Assistance Scheme

Singapore citizen students may apply for financial assistance from the Ministry of Education.

Criteria for eligibility:

- Family's gross household income: not exceeding \$4,000/- per month.
- Family's per capita income (PCI): not exceeding \$1,000/- per month.

Successful applicants will receive:

- Full waiver of school fees of \$5.00 and miscellaneous fees of \$20.00 per month (Autonomous School fees of \$3.00 per month are to be paid using the FAS students' Edusave Funds)
- Free Textbooks and School Attire
- Public Transport Subsidy of \$21/mth in the form of E-Vouchers which are to be redeemed from
  Transitlink each month. Sec 1 FAS students should redeem for both January and February Evouchers (\$42/-) in February. Thereafter, redemption is on a monthly basis (between 28th of
  current month to 10th of the following month).
- Subsidy for Meals in School Canteen (\$4.10 per meal x 10 meals per week during term time only).
   Students on FAS need to activate their Student Smart Card at the school's General Office (one-time activation), before they can use it for payment at the terminal at any canteen stall on a weekly basis to receive their subsidies. Secondary 1 students are required to activate their new Secondary School Student Smart Card at the school's General Office when they receive it in March 2026 to continue receiving subsidies.

Students who were on the FAS in 2025 and wish to renew their FAS in 2026 will need to submit a new application.

#### **6 OTHER MATTERS**

#### 6.1 Student Smart Card

Sec 1 students are to continue using the Primary School Student Smart Card for concessionary travel on public transport. Students who need to purchase the Bus Concession Pass will have to buy the Secondary Level Bus Concession Pass. The new Secondary School Student Smart Card will be delivered to the school tentatively in March 2026.

## **6.2 School Bus Transport**

As St. Margaret's School (Secondary) is well connected by buses and MRT (Circle Line: *Farrer Rd Station*; Downtown Line 2: *Botanic Gardens Station*), there will be **no** school bus transport service provided by the school.

The school does **not** have any authorised bus companies to provide bus services for our students.

#### 1 SCHOOL HOURS

### 1.1 Reporting Time

#### 1.2 Dismissal Time

Dismissal time differs from day to day. The timetable and CCA schedule will be issued to your daughter/ward at a later date. You will also be informed of the details of enrichment programmes separately.

#### 2 SCHOOL SAFETY AND SECURITY MATTERS

Parents/Guardians who drive their daughter/ward to school may wish to note that entry to the school is via Prince Road. There is no access to the school via Farrer Road.

Roads leading to the school are also the same roads to access Nanyang Primary School. Traffic *congestion* is expected in the mornings of school days and students are advised to reach school early.

Parents/Guardians can only drop off or pick up their daughter/ward at the porch next to the school canteen. There is no waiting or parking at the porch at all times. Parents/Guardians are not allowed to park their vehicles in school. Advise your daughter/ward to text/call you in the school canteen when she is ready to be picked up.

We strongly encourage parent/guardian to arrange for *pick up* at the HDB car park (Exit Gate G near Blk 4 Queen's Road). The gate will be opened for egress at 1pm.

Parents with appointments with school personnel may park their vehicles at the nearby HDB car park and register at the Security Guardhouse.



#### 2 MOTHER TONGUE LANGUAGES

MOE bilingual policy is applicable for all students to offer English Language and a Mother Tongue Language (MTL).

# 2.1 Mother Tongue-in-lieu: NTIL (Non-Tamil Indian Language)

- a. Students granted approval in primary school to offer a NTIL are <u>not</u> required to reapply in secondary school. They are required to continue offering the approved NTIL at secondary level.
- b. SMS(S) has an "In-school Parallel Programme" for Hindi language. Students offering Hindi Language may learn the language in our school.
- c. Students offering the other NTILs are required to attend lessons with the approved NTIL community groups and sit for examinations set by the Board for the Teaching and Testing of South Asian Languages.

## 2.2 Mother Tongue-in-lieu: Asian/Foreign Languages (AsL/FL)

Students granted approval in primary school to offer AsL (Arabic, Burmese and Thai) or FL (French, German and Japanese) are <u>not</u> required to reapply in secondary school.

#### NOTE:

- a. As Instruction is not provided by MOE, students are required to learn the language privately.
- b. Students need to provide documents (e.g. marked assignment, result slip, payment receipt) at Mid-Year and Year-End to the school to show that they are learning AsL/FL regularly.
- c. Students are required to take the AsL/FL subjects at G3 level and sit for the Singapore-Cambridge Secondary Education Certificate (SEC) examination.
- d. Students are required to fulfil the MTL requirement by attaining the minimum AsL/FL grade for admission into a junior college or centralised institute. There is no Higher AsL/FL or syllabus 'B' for AsL/FL.

### 2.3 Mother Tongue Language Exemption

2.3.1 A student who has taken a MTL subject during PSLE is **not eligible** to apply for Mother Tongue Language Exemption. If your daughter/ward was granted exemption in primary school, she would have already received an official letter of exemption and is **not** required to reapply for exemption in secondary school.

## 2.3.2 A student will only be considered for exemption if she meets any of the following criteria:

- a. Student who only joined the Singapore education system midstream after prolonged absence from our school system (e.g. an international student who joined a Singapore school only at Primary 5).
- b. Student with no or weak prior learning of any of our official MTLs or languages that can be offered as MTL-in-lieu.
- c. Students diagnosed with Special Educational Needs (SEN) and with difficulties coping with overall learning.

# 2.4 Higher Mother Tongue Language (HMTL)

Students who are eligible to offer HMTL will receive a *notification & offer* letter via Parents Gateway (PG) by <u>Monday, 22 December 2025</u>. Students need to indicate their choice via PG by <u>Monday, 29</u> <u>December 2025</u>.

Students who do not qualify for HMTL after PSLE may be offered HMTL at the end of Secondary 1 based on their performance (merit).

Students who offer HMTL will have to take the G3 Singapore-Cambridge SEC MTL examination at the end of Secondary 3 before they are allowed to take the G3 Singapore-Cambridge SEC HMTL examination at the end of Secondary 4.

In SMS(S), only Higher Chinese lessons are conducted in our school; 6 periods are held within curriculum time and the remaining 2 periods *outside* curriculum time.

Students who wish to offer <u>Higher Malay</u> will need to attend lessons at designated centres outside curriculum time. They may choose to attend Higher Malay lessons at one of the following centres:

- MOELC Bishan
- Anderson Secondary School
- Bukit Panjang Government High School
- Raffles Institution
- Tanjong Katong Secondary School

Students who wish to offer <u>Higher Tamil</u> will need to attend lessons at designated centres outside curriculum time. They may choose to attend Higher Tamil lessons at one of the following centres:

- Umar Pulavar Tamil Language Centre (UPTLC)
- Jurong West Secondary School
- Marsiling Secondary School
- Pasir Ris Crest Secondary School

#### 2.5 Third Language / Malay Special Programme (MSP) / Chinese Special Programme (CSP)

Students who have applied for this programme will receive the outcome of their application status from MOE through the school via Parents Gateway (PG) by Monday, 22 December 2025. Successful applicants will have to register at the Zonal Centre or MOE Language Centre by the date and time specified on the letter of offer.

# 3 FULL SUBJECT-BASED BANDING (FSBB)

**3.1** At the <u>start of Secondary One</u>, eligible students can offer English Language, Mother Tongue Languages, Mathematics and Science at a **more demanding level (MDL)** based on their PSLE Achievement Level (AL) for each of these subjects.

Students who meet the minimum entry requirement for MDL will receive a <u>notification to offer</u> via Parents Gateway (PG) by <u>Monday, 22 December 2025</u>. School will need to receive the response by <u>Monday, 29 December 2025</u>.

# 3.2 After the Secondary 1 mid-year and year-end assessments

- 3.2.1 Students may be offered English Language, Mother Tongue Languages, Mathematics and Science at MDL if they meet school-based qualifying criteria after the Secondary 1 mid-year and year-end assessments.
- **3.2.2** For <u>Humanities</u> subjects, eligible students who meet school-based criteria after Secondary 1 yearend assessments may be offered to take them at MDL when they progress to Secondary 2.

# 5 ART ELECTIVE PROGRAMME (AEP) AND ENHANCED MUSIC PROGRAMME (EMP)

### 5.1 Art Elective Programme (AEP)

The secondary-level AEP is a 4-year curriculum programme which aims to develop students with interest, potential and passion to pursue an in-depth study of art and design. Students who are selected and admitted into the secondary-level AEP are expected to commit to the programme for 4 years. They will need to attend all lessons and enrichment activities offered at the National Junior College (AEP Centre for students from non-AEP schools). They will attend these lessons in lieu of Lower Secondary Art lessons at their own schools. Selection and withdrawal from the AEP are strictly subject to the approval of the MOE Arts Education Branch.

AEP students may take AEP in place of lower secondary Design & Technology (D&T) and Food & Consumer Education (FCE) lessons to manage their curriculum time and learning load. Hence, they will not be eligible to offer Nutrition and Food Science (NFS) at the upper secondary level. Note that SMS(S) currently does not offer D&T at the upper secondary level.

#### 5.2 Enhanced Music Programme (EMP)

The EMP is offered at St. Margaret's School (Secondary) and application is open to Secondary 2 students who have interest, musical potential and talent.

At Secondary 1, students who are interested in the EMP should put in effort in developing their musical abilities which need not be through private music lessons or certification by external music examination boards. For many students, this can be through active participation in the lower secondary music curriculum and Music co-curricular activities (CCA), where they learn to:

- Make connections to music concepts when listening to music
- Perform by singing or playing an instrument fluently
- Create or arrange songs/music

The Enhanced Music Programme (EMP) is a 2-year programme at the upper secondary level that leads to the Singapore-Cambridge SEC G3 Music or G3 Higher Music examination. # Home-based Learning (HBL) Days

HBL Days have become an integral part of secondary school life since its introduction in 2021.

Students stay at home to engage in self-directed learning according to the timetable of the day, and one student-initiated learning (SIL) where students are given a choice in researching topics of interest or picking up new skills beyond the school curriculum.

Information on the learning tasks for each HBL Day can be found on their respective subject's Google Classrooms. By planning and monitoring their learning for the day, students are given the opportunity to develop self-directedness in learning.

To enable your child to complete her learning for the day, please help ensure that she has access to a computer with wireless internet connection and a conducive space to work. If your child does not have access to these facilities, please inform your child's form teacher by Friday, 16 January, so that the school can provide the necessary support.

# Personal Learning Devices (PLD)

In 2020, MOE launched the National Digital Literacy Programme (NDLP) to help students strengthen their digital literacy. One of the components of the NDLP is the introduction of the Personalised Digital Learning Programme (PDLP) whereby every secondary school student will own a school prescribed Personal Learning Device (PLD).

All Sec 1 students are required to purchase a school prescribed PLD to support their learning throughout their secondary school education. Singapore citizens may utilise their *Edusave* to purchase their PLD.

Information on the procurement of the PLDs will be shared with parents via an announcement on Parents Gateway by Term 1 Week 2. School will also provide more information on the role of parents and students on good practices on the use of PLD for productivity and learning.

The students are expected to receive their PLDs by Term 2 Week 1.
