



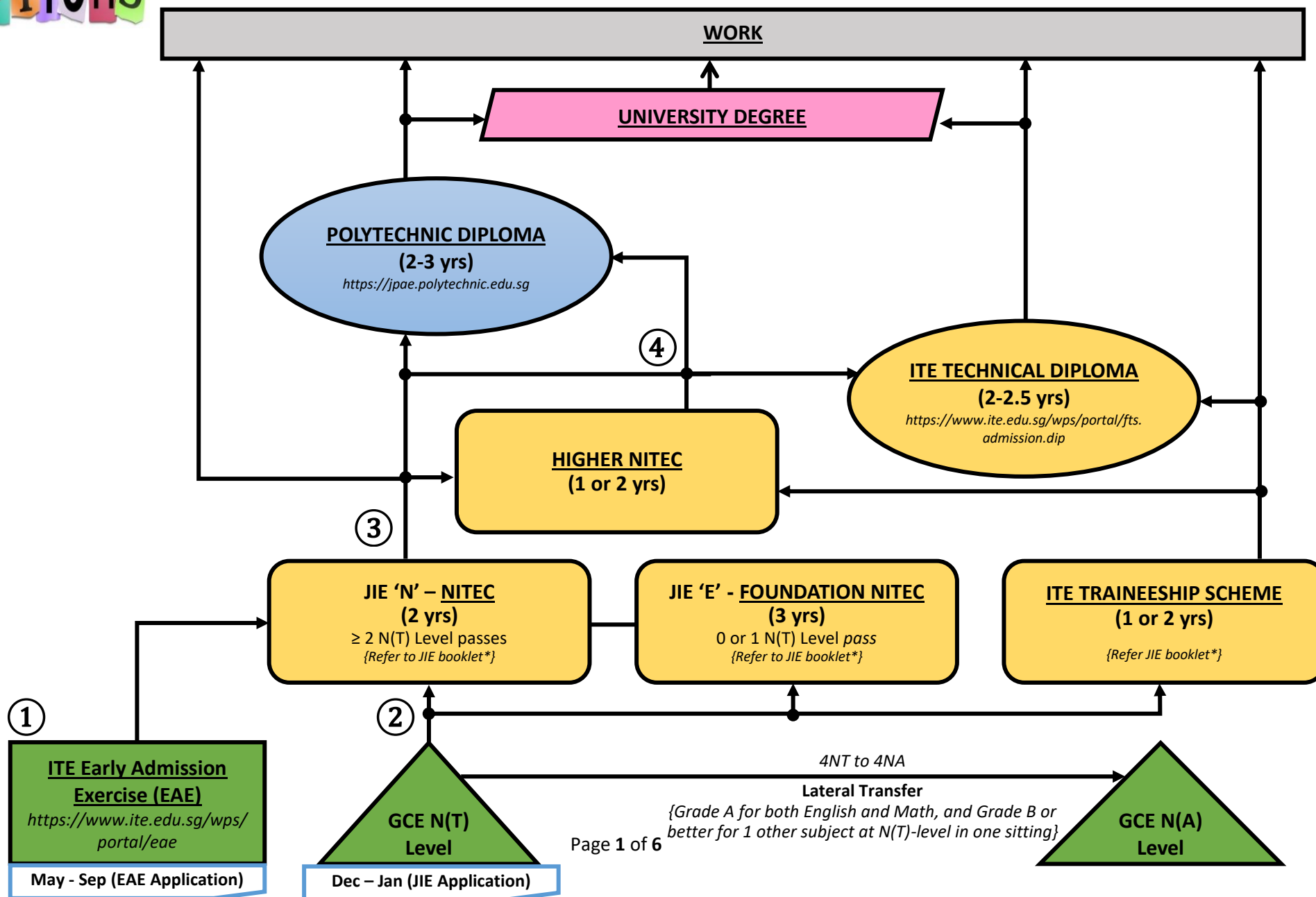

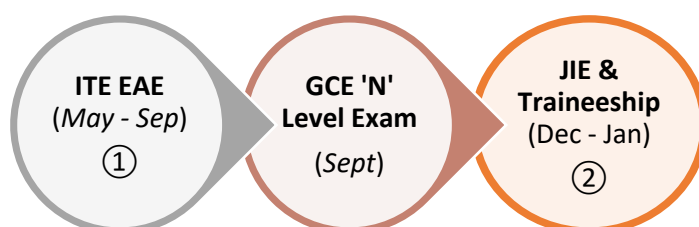

How to apply



① ITE Early Admissions Exercise (ITE EAE)

- Aptitude-based admissions exercise that allows conditional offer for admission to ITE courses based on your aptitude and interest before taking GCE N(T) Level exams.

- EAE Stages
 - Application Stage – May
 - Selection Stage – June to July
 - Offer & Acceptance Stage – August
 - Withdrawal Stage – September
(Students who wish to withdraw from their accepted offers can proceed to any of the ITE Customer & Visitor Centres during this period. They will then be able to take part in the JIE after the exams.)
- Preparation
 - Write-ups of up to 100 words on why you are interested in the courses (include relevant skills/activities/experiences)
 - Prepare supporting documents (e.g. portfolio, evidence of experiences, CCA record)
 - Prepare for interview

② Joint Intake Exercise (JIE)

The Joint Intake Exercise is conducted after the release of the N-Level results.

- Application Period – December and January
- Intake – January

A) JIE 'N' for the 2-Year *Nitec* Courses

- 2 or more GCE N(T) Level pass
- 2-Year National ITE Certificate (*Nitec*) courses
- Full-Time Education or Traineeship course

B) JIE 'E' for the 3-Year *Nitec* Courses with *Enhanced Nitec Foundation Programme*

- 0 or 1 GCE N(T) Level pass
- 3-Year *Nitec* Courses with *Enhanced Nitec Foundation Programme*

Students may apply for *Nitec* courses under both the JIE 'N' and JIE 'E' intake exercises. However, you can only receive one offer from either intake exercises.

GCE 'N' Level holders applying for admission to full-time *Nitec* courses must first satisfy the entry requirements including passes in the pre-requisite subjects for the courses applied. Admission is merit-based, and posting to a course is based on aggregate of best 4 GCE 'N' Level subjects, including pre-requisite subjects and bonus points where applicable and is subjected to availability of vacancies.

Computation of ITE Aggregate Points for admission to *Nitec* in JIE

Normal (Technical) Grade	ITE Aggregate Points	Normal (Academic) Grade	ITE Aggregate Points
A (75% and above)	1	1,2 (70% and above)	1
B (70% - 74%)	2	3 (65% - 69%)	2
C (60% - 69%)	3	4 (60% - 64%)	3
D (50% - 59%)	4	5 (50% - 59%)	4
U (below 50%)	5	U (below 50%)	5

Pre-requisite Subjects Bonus Points in JIE

Types of Bonus Points	No of Bonus Points awarded
Grades of 1 to 5 for pre-requisite NA subjects (eg, Maths, English Language and Science) for the courses applied for.	2 points for each pre-requisite NA subject (up to a maximum of 4 points for the course applied).

A total of up to 6 points including CCA and Pre-requisite Subjects Bonus can be awarded.

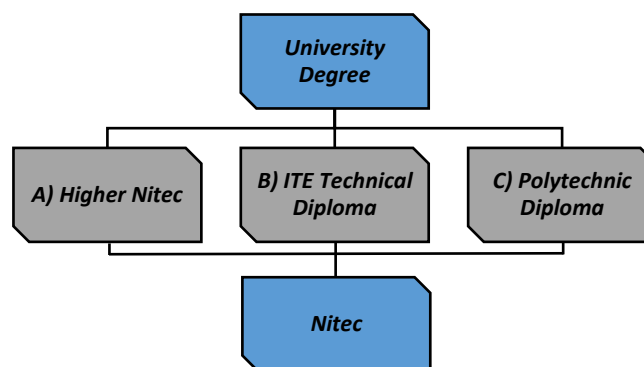

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Progression as ITE Graduate

③ Progression from Nitec

A) to Higher Nitec

- Progression path from Nitec to Year 1 or 2 of Higher Nitec Courses
- Nitec Progression to Higher Nitec Courses

Example: Jane achieves a GPA of 3.0 in Nitec in Beauty & Wellness and wishes to know what Higher Nitec Courses is she eligible for admission. She goes to the website (above) and finds out she is eligible for 14 two-year Higher Nitec Courses and 1 one-year Higher Nitec Course.

B) to ITE Technical Diploma

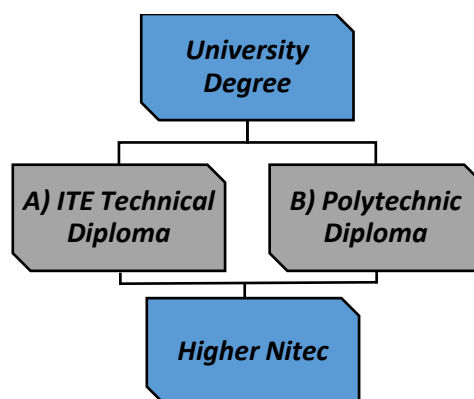
- ITE offers three specialised diplomas:

C) to Polytechnic Diploma

Example: May achieves a GPA of 3.6 in Nitec in Business Services and wishes to know if she is eligible for Polytechnic Courses. She goes to the website (above) and finds out she meets the minimum GPA criteria for 14 Polytechnic Courses but she is aware that her result has not met some Average GPA Band which means that she may not be given the course of her choice due to high competition.

④ Progression from Higher Nitec



A) to ITE Technical Diploma

B) to Polytechnic Diploma

Example: Elizabeth achieves a GPA of 3.2 in Higher Nitec in Early Childhood Education and wishes to know if she is eligible for Polytechnic Courses. She goes to the website (above) and finds out she meets the minimum GPA criteria for 23 Polytechnic Courses but she is aware that her result has not met some Average GPA Band which means that she may not be given the course of her choice due to high competition.
