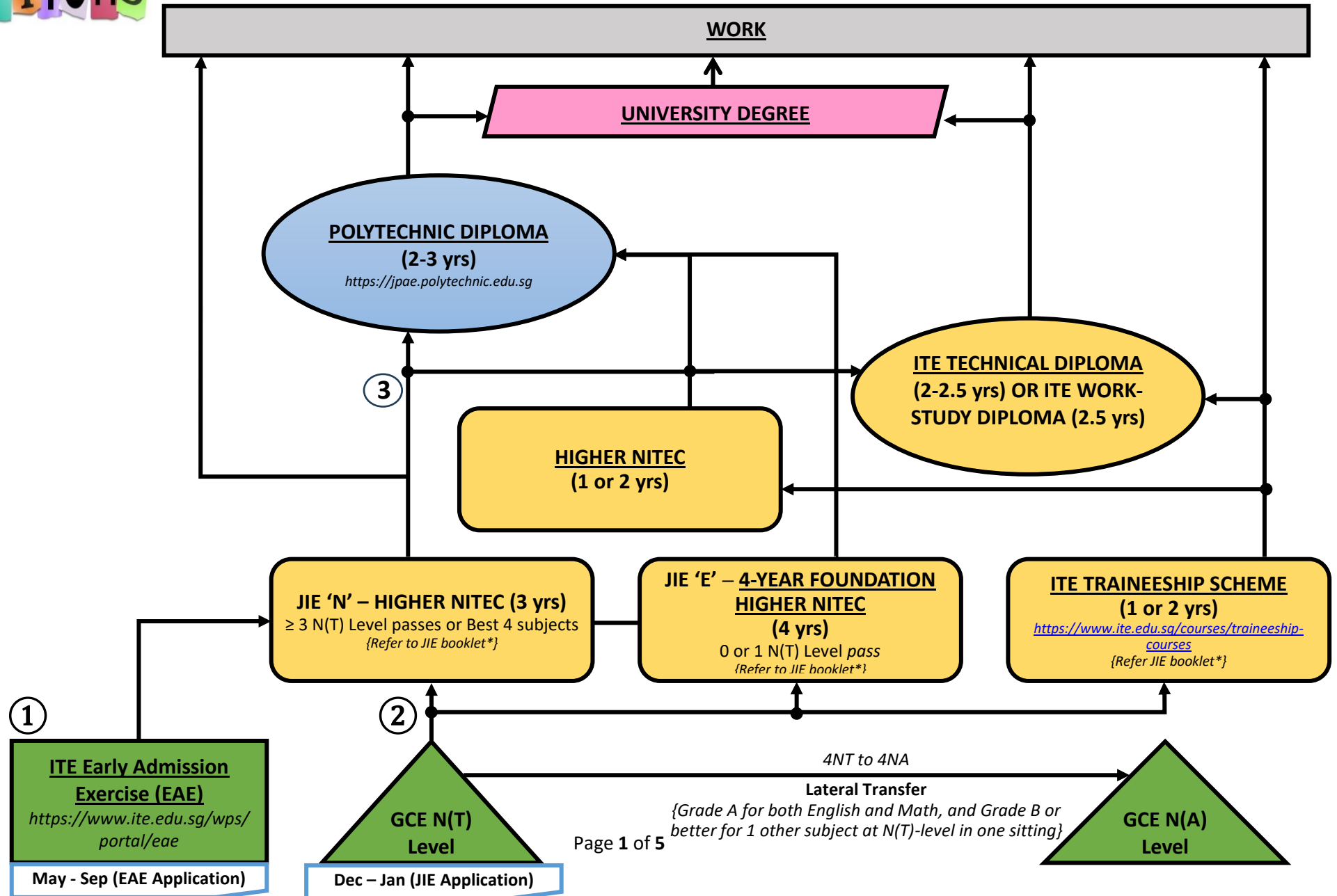

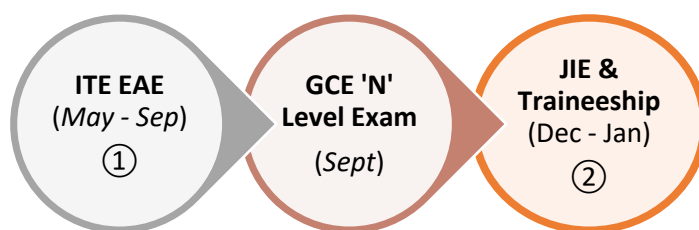

How to apply



① ITE Early Admissions Exercise (ITE EAE)

- Aptitude-based admissions exercise that allows conditional offer for admission to ITE courses based on your aptitude and interest before taking GCE N(T) Level exams.

- EAE Stages
 - Application Stage – May
 - Selection Stage – June to July
 - Offer & Acceptance Stage – August
 - Withdrawal Stage – September
(Students who wish to withdraw from their accepted offers can email ITE training@ite.edu.sg during this period. They will then be able to take part in the JIE after the exams.)
- Preparation
 - Write-ups of up to 100 words on why you are interested in the courses (include relevant skills/activities/experiences)
 - Prepare supporting documents (e.g. portfolio, evidence of experiences, CCA record)
 - Prepare for interview

② Joint Intake Exercise (JIE)

The Joint Intake Exercise is conducted after the release of the N-Level results.

- Application Period – December and January
- Intake – January

A) JIE 'N' for the 3-year Higher Nitec Courses

- 3 or more GCE N(T) Level pass
- Admission is based on Best 4 subjects, including prerequisite subjects and bonus points
- 3-Year Higher Nitec Courses
- Full-Time Education course

B) JIE 'E' for the 4-Year Higher Nitec Courses with Enhanced Nitec Foundation Programme

- 0 or 1 GCE N(T) Level pass
- 4-Year Higher Nitec Courses with *Enhanced Nitec Foundation Programme*

Students may apply for *Higher Nitec* courses under both the JIE 'N' and JIE 'E' intake exercises. However, you can only receive one offer from either intake exercises.

GCE 'N' Level holders applying for admission to full-time *Higher Nitec* courses must first satisfy the entry requirements including passes in the prerequisite subjects for the courses applied. Admission is merit-based, and posting to a course is based on aggregate of best 4 GCE 'N' Level subjects, including prerequisite subjects and bonus points where applicable and is subjected to availability of vacancies.

Computation of ITE Aggregate Points for admission to Higher Nitec in JIE

Normal (Technical) Grade	ITE Aggregate Points	Normal (Academic) Grade	ITE Aggregate Points
A (75% and above)	1	1,2,3 (65% and above)	1

N(A)-Level Grade 6 and N(T)-Level Grade E will not be allowed for fulfillment of Minimum Entry Requirements for prerequisite subjects for ITE's 3-year Higher Nitec courses. Students with these grades can opt for courses without these prerequisite subjects as their Minimum Entry Requirements.

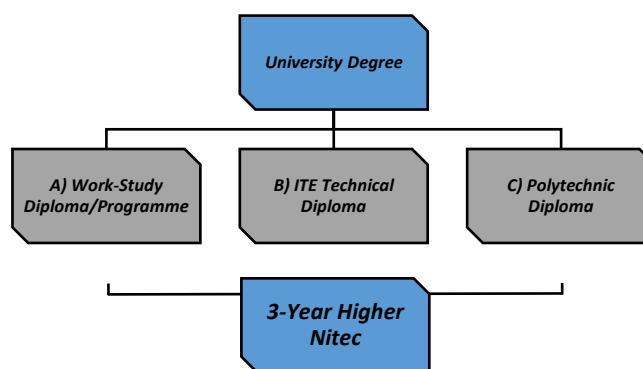
A total of up to 2 bonus points from CCA grades can be awarded.

③ **Progression from Higher Nitec**

A) **Work-Study Programme**

Students who have completed their Higher Nitec studies may apply to enrol in a Work-Study Diploma offered at ITE or Work-Study Certificate leading to Work-Study Diploma/Part-Time Diploma offered at one of the five local polytechnics.

The ITE Work-Study Diploma (WSDip) programme offers ITE graduates an excellent opportunity to jumpstart their careers while working towards a nationally recognized diploma.

Work-Study Trainees will acquire invaluable hands-on experience through On-the-Job Training with industry experts, simultaneously benefiting from the insights of ITE/Polytechnic lecturers, effectively bridging the gap between theory and practice.

B) to ITE Technical Diploma

ITE offers full-time Technical Diplomas to *Higher Nitec* graduates, in collaboration with renowned institutions in France, Germany, Hong Kong and Switzerland. Furthermore, students will have opportunities for student exchanges and industrial attachments at these overseas institutions!

C) to Polytechnic Diploma

- To be eligible for consideration for admission to the various polytechnic courses, you must achieve the minimum **NET** Grade Point Average (GPA) (including CCA bonus points) in your *Higher Nitec* course.

Example: May achieves a GPA of 3.6 in Nitec in Business Services and wishes to know if she is eligible for Polytechnic Courses. She goes to the website (above) and finds out she meets the minimum GPA criteria for 20 Polytechnic Courses but she is aware that her result has not met some Average GPA Band which means that she may not be given the course of her choice due to high competition.

Other Post-Secondary Educational Institutions or Private Schools
