Revised Last Grade Nomenclature Across Subject Levels and Downward Grade Mapping

(a) Revised Last Grade Nomenclature Across Subject Levels

Currently, the last grade for the GCE O, N(A) and N(T) level subjects are reflected as grades 'F9' and 'U' respectively.

To recognise students' efforts in attempting the subject regardless of their achievement, the 'U' Grade in N(A) and N(T) will be replaced with Grade 6 and Grade E respectively. The last grade for the O-level will be reflected as Grade 9.

All grades, including the last grade, will be reflected in the student's result slip and examination certificate.

These changes will be applicable from the **2023** graduating cohort for their national examinations, and from 2024 for all levels.

Students will not be able to use the N(A) Grade 6 and N(T) Grade E for aggregate computation for admission to Polytechnic Foundation Programme, Direct-Entry-Scheme to Polytechnic Programme and Secondary 5.

This is similar to the current practice for Grade U. Details can be found in Annex A.

(b) Revised Downward Grade Mapping

There will be a revised downward grade mapping for subjects taken at more demanding levels. This will provide an updated reflection of the relative curricular and assessment demands between subject levels.

The revision will be applicable from the **2023** graduating cohort. The revised downward grade mapping can be found in Annex A.

1. School Annual Cross Country (7 August from 7.30am – 10.30am)

The school will be conducting our annual Cross Country on Monday, 7 August from 7.30am to 10.30am at Marina Barrage/Bay East Gardens.

3. Adjustment to Timetable (Odd Week Thursday Timetable will run on Odd Week Friday, 11 August)

To allow for the recovery of curriculum time due to disruption caused by school holidays and events that fall on Odd Week Thursdays (e.g. Hari Raya Haji and National Day), the school will run the Odd Week Thursday timetable on Friday, 11 August.

Teachers' Day in Singapore is celebrated on the last Friday of Term 3 and the school will be celebrating with this meaningful day with our teachers on Thursday, 31 August.

Students will report to school at 7.30am and be dismissed at 11.00am.


