2. GCE N-Level Listening Comprehension Examinations

The GCE N-Level Listening Comprehension Examinations will be conducted on Tuesday, 12 September and Wednesday, 20 September.

Students identified for this Study Camp will be notified after the release of the End-of-Year Examination results.
